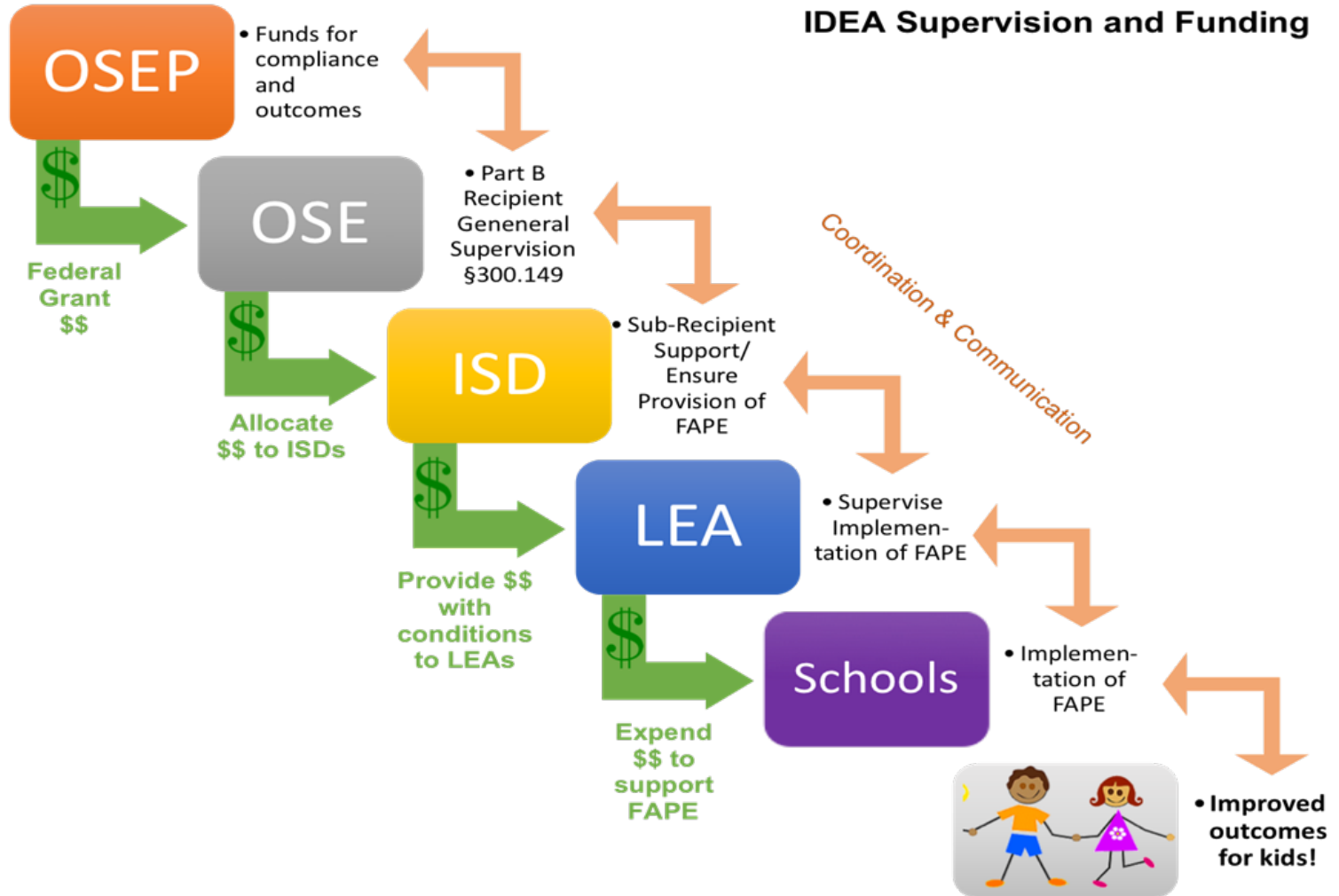

- Spring 2016 the OSE has **redefine** the ISD EOSD and Transition Coordination grants

 - ✦ Data-informed technical assistance with support from the OSE monitoring team
 - ✦ Ongoing progress monitoring to better support local district improvement effort
 - ✦ Liaison to the OSE for monitoring and the access records, etc. needed for state level requirements
 - **ISD Transition Coordination Grant**
 - ✦ SPP/APR B-13
 - ✦ Meaningful transition planning

OSE Support for Flint Community Schools



1. The OSE grant funded initiative, Michigan's Integrated Behavior and Learning Initiative (MiBLSi), is adding three new staff to their organization specifically designed to work in 9 elementary schools in Flint
2. These three staff members will address literacy and behavior in a Multi-Tiered System of Support, for early childhood and elementary students
3. Steps are being taken to implement by fall of 2016

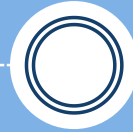
