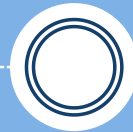

MDE State Board of Education Policy



- The Emergency Use of Seclusion and Restraint legislation was signed into law by Lt. Governor Brian Calley on December 29, 2017
- The MDE State Board of Education legislative committee will review the proposed policy Friday, March 3, 2017
- The point of emphasis.... ***seclusion and restraint are PROHIBITED except in the case of emergency to:***
 - *Ensure the safety of the student and/or staff*

Support for PBIS and Crisis Training



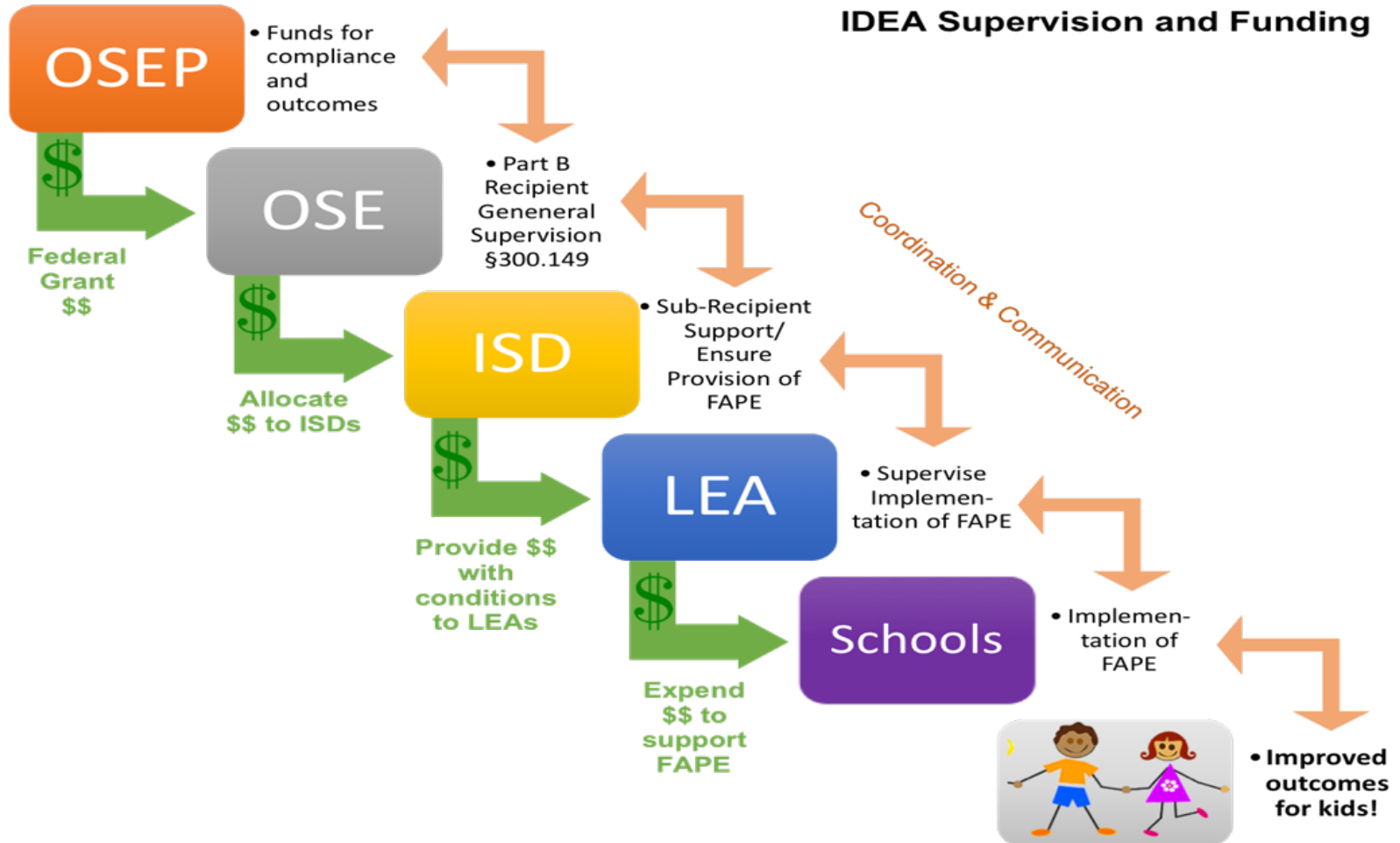
- 4 ISDs have been selected to receive support for the implementation of Positive Behavioral Supports Intervention (PBIS)

State Support Structure to Ensure a FAPE

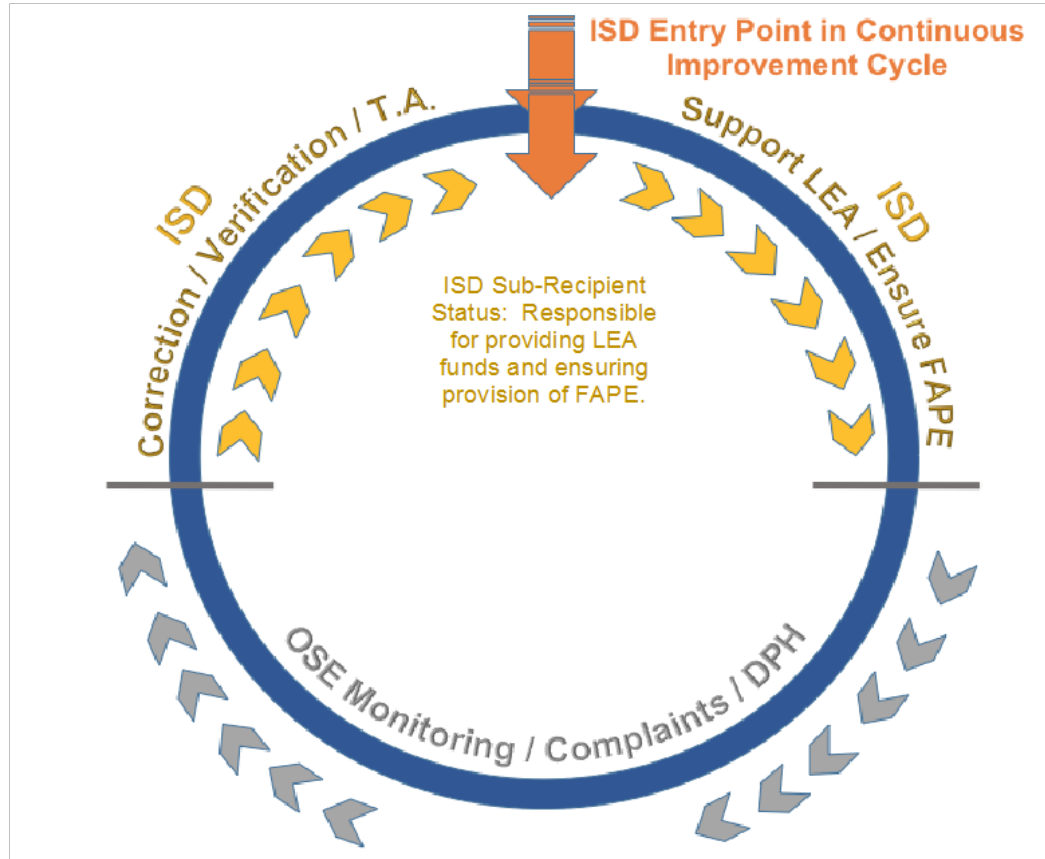


The shared obligation to ensure the provision of a FAPE

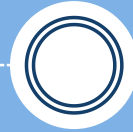
